<p>PROBLEM (What is the problem?)</p>	<p>Non-White people engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White people.</p>
<p>QUESTION (What is the question?)</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Why do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) <u>not</u> classify themselves as victims of Racism (White Supremacy) when engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People? 2. Why do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) <u>choose</u> to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People? 3. If victims of Racism (White Supremacy) engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People, what do they see as the benefit for themselves? 4. Do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) view their being engaged in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People as a privilege? 5. Do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) view their being engaged in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People as a protection against mistreatment based on color in the system of Racism (White Supremacy)? 6. Do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) who engaged in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People feel that by doing so they are solving the problem of Racism (White Supremacy)? 7. By being engaged in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People, do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) feel a sense of superiority (<i>show-offism</i>) over other victims of Racism (White Supremacy)? 8. Do victims of Racism (White Supremacy) who engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White people associate doing so with a “Higher Social” status/acceptance among White society? 9. What perceived <u>positive effects</u> have victims of Racism (White Supremacy) who engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People had because of doing so? 10. What perceived <u>negative effects</u> have victims of Racism (White Supremacy) who engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White People had because of doing so? <p><i>Note: The above list of questions form the foundation of the problems I believe need answering to solve the problem of victims of Racism (White Supremacy) engaging in sex with White people while the System of Racism (White Supremacy) still exists. I’ve attached the list of questions asked directly to each participant to this Journal.</i></p>

RESEARCH (Finding out enough to ask a good question.)	My research was based on past and present observations and experiences personally (family members), public (witness in society), and social media.
HYPOTHESIS (What do you think will happen?)	I hypothesize that the participants in this Counter-Racism experiment will view and/or explain their choice to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people as having been solely their decision based on non-race related factors, and that they do not see themselves as victims of Racism (White Supremacy).
PROCEDURE (What will you do?)	<p>To conduct this Counter-Racism experiment, follow the below steps:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make observation(s) of Sex (UICCSC definition) between non-White people with White people (personal, public, and/or social media settings). 2. Based on those observations, formulated 10-20 questions that are to be asked to non-White people who engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White people. <i>The questions asked in this Counter-Racism experiment were used to begin the process of solving the problem of non-White people engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) with White people that I personally wanted answered. You may use these questions or choose questions based on problems you want solved as it relates to non-White people engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationships” with White people.</i> 3. Chose the materials you will use to conduct this Counter-Racism experiment. 4. Selected 2-5 non-White participants who were willing to go through the process of answering the questions. <i>3 participants were used in this Counter-Racism experiment.</i> 5. Scheduled times, places, and/or methods in which the questions would be answered and recorded. 6. Conduct the interviews with each participant who agrees to doing a live (<i>asking the questions directly to participants</i>) interview and/or send participants the list of questions if preferred. 7. Save all data collected. 8. Complete the Counter-Racism Project Science Experiment Journal to record your experiment.
MATERIALS (What do we need?)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Computer • Cellular Phone • Call Recorder App for recording phone interviews (<i>Suggestion: Inform all participants who will be audio recorded that they will be recorded and that the recording will be made public for the purpose of your experiment. Avoid recording any personal information/identifiers such as the name of the participants or where they reside</i>) • Communication platform (What’s App) • Email

<p>RESULTS (What happened?)</p>	<p>As a result of conducting this Counter-Racism experiment, the problem of non-White people engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people was not solved and further experiments will be required.</p>
<p>CONCLUSION (What does data support?)</p>	<p>After conducting this Counter-Racism experiment, I’ve concluded that the problem of non-White people engaging in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people is one far more complex than I realized and that the solution to this problem will require more research, observation, and perhaps other types of experiments to solve.</p> <p>It is my personal belief, based on what it is that I do understand about Racism (White Supremacy), what it is and how it works – the frequency and common occurrence of victims of Racism (White Supremacy) choosing to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people is based on several factors and rooted in confusion and a lack of understanding of Racism (White Supremacy).</p> <p>It is my opinion, that the logic behind why Neely Fuller Jr. has stated “If you don’t know what Racism (White Supremacy-what it is and how it works-everything else that you understand will only confuse you”.</p> <p>My overall sentiment is that people who chose to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people are highly confused and/or willfully oblivious to the severity of choosing to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people and its impact in solving the problem of replacing the global system of Racism (White Supremacy) and replacing it with one of justice.</p> <p>Finally, the task of solving the problem of why non-White people choose to engage in Sex (UICCSC definition) / “relationship(s)” with White people is a lofty task that requires more research and data collection over an extended period.</p>
<p>REFLECTION (What would you do differently next time?)</p>	<p>In reflecting on the experiment conducted, I’ve concluded that the questions asked to participants, may need to be refined and structured in a way that reveals more truth.</p>
